Employer Spreadsheet updates

Please make sure you are using the latest New Starts spreadsheet checker. It includes the new 2019 employee contribution rates. Anyone using the old checker will not be able to correctly validate the data for scheme members joining on or after April 1st.

Please also make sure you are using the latest "Change in hours or name or address or department" spreadsheet.

To allow us to upload the hour changes directly onto our system we require the 5 digit employer number in order to identify the record to be updated.

Amendment Regulations

SPPA have advised that The Local Government Pension Scheme (Scotland) (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations 2019 are now complete.

They are due to be signed by Scottish Ministers and laid in the Scottish Parliament this week.

These regulations will come into force on 28th June 2019 but some changes, made as a result of the flexibilities brought about by the Finance Act 2015, will be backdated to 1st April 2015.

McCloud Judgement

The Supreme Court is expected to decide before the end of May whether to hear the Government's appeal.

HM Treasury has opened a 12 week consultation on draft regulations restricting exit payments in the public sector. **This consultation does not apply to Scotland.** Scottish Ministers are still considering responses to a separate consultation which they carried out in Scotland in 2017.
