A 2.4% increase for 2019

2019's pension increase will be **+2.4%**, in line with September 2018's CPI inflation figure.

We will adjust **employee members**' **CARE accounts** by **+2.4%** on 1 April 2019.

The SPPA will use **+2.4%** to set 2019 / 2020 **employee** contribution rate salary bands (usually published in March).

2018 / 2019 employer contributions have been set by the 2017 actuarial valuation.

The lifetime allowance will rise to **£1,055,000** for 2019/20.

Pensions politics

There were no major pension changes announced in the 29th October Budget, but a change in the Treasury's SCAPE discount rate was confirmed. This will have some impact: the factors we use in various calculations will need to be updated by GAD. As a result we will be suspending non-club transfers with immediate effect. Some of the other budget "small print" (GMP equalisation, the future of CPI) might also impact at some later stage.

Structure Review
