#### **Actuarial valuation as at 31 Mar 2017**

We are currently busy checking and cleaning member data received from employers as part of the 2017 actuarial valuation exercise.

Our expectations for the results of the valuation are as follows:

- the funding level will be similar to 2014 (94.3%) or probably a little higher; BUT
- low expectations for future investment returns make the cost of future service more expensive;
- that puts upward pressure on the employer contribution rate (less from investments means more from employers);
- for local authorities and employers with a guarantee we should be able to keep the rate at 19.3%; but
- some other employers may see increases
- draft results will be available in December.

#### **Automatic enrolment**

The LGPC has updated its **Guide**. A point to note (para 14 B) is that eligible jobholders who opted out more than 12 months prior to their AE date cannot be AEed.
