Automatic enrolment

The Government has confirmed that for tax year 2015 /16 the 'qualifying earnings' band will remain in line with the National Insurance lower and upper earnings limit (£5,824 and £42,385 respectively) but that the earnings trigger will be frozen at its current level of £10,000.

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) is **consulting on proposals to further simplify** the automatic enrolment process and reduce burdens on employers, see
